**Service: Sexual Assault Support Services**

**Description:**

The Sexual Assault Support Services provides emergency response to victims of sexual assault, any age or gender. The Sexual Assault Response Coordinator supports victims and offers information on their rights and reporting options and can link them to services for follow up. They organize the Sexual Assault Response Team (SART) to ensure someone is always available to provide timely support for victims. She also provides training and education around sexual assault support, rights, and reporting options to community organizations and outlying areas as requested.

The emergency sexual assault response line is monitored 24/7.

**Description:** Our Free Store (and Donation Room) is operated in a large basement space beneath the Women and Children's Transition House, which is beside our anti-violence and admin programs. On average, 300 people accessed our donation room every month and 250-300 large and small bags and boxes are donated every month. The DR is a space much like any thrift store; open and inviting with items displayed. What makes it different, and one of its kind in Terrace, is that all items are free to community members who rely heavily on it to meet basic needs.

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## Support for Disabled Individuals

### **Service: Support Following a Brain Injury**

**Description:** The TDCSS Acquired Brain Injury Program is for people who have a brain injury from trauma, stroke, brain tumour, aneurysm or other causes resulting in physical, cognitive and emotional changes.

Referrals and funding are received from the Northern Health Authority.

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### **Service: Services for Children & Youth with Support Needs (CYSN)**

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## **Service: Shared transit service for people with permanent or temporary disabilities**

### **Description:**

HandyDART is an accessible, door-to-door shared transit service for people with permanent or temporary disabilities that prevent them from using fixed-route transit without assistance from another person. handyDART picks you up at your accessible door and drops you off at the accessible door of your destination. Customers must first register, at no charge, for this program.

HandyDART is part of the Accessible Services offered from your local transit service. Many handyDART customers use a combination of fixed-route and handyDART services depending on their travel needs and destination.

Two types of accessible transit service are offered: shared door-to-door handyDART service and fixed-route service. Fixed-route service includes either low-floor buses with ramps, or lift-equipped buses on fixed routes and schedules.

Fixed-route buses have securements for wheelchairs or scooters. To check if a stop is accessible, call your local transit office. Customers using wheelchairs or scooters, registered handyDART customers or CNIB pass holders may travel with an attendant. Attendants travel free and must board and exit at the same stop as the customer requiring assistance and help load and secure mobility aids on the bus.

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**Service:** Issuing parking permits for people with disabilities

**Description:** A parking permit for people with disabilities ensures that when a person has mobility limitations, they can park in one of the designated parking spots throughout British Columbia. People with mobility limitations are entitled to a permit even if they do not own a vehicle. As long as the parking permit holder is either driving or being transported in the vehicle, a valid parking permit may be displayed on the rear view mirror when the vehicle is parked in a designated spot.

There are two (2) types of parking permits for people with disabilities:

1. Permanent Parking Permit: Valid for a period of three (3) years, and renewable.
2. Temporary Parking Permit: Valid for a period of one (1) month to twelve (12) months, and not renewable. Clients requiring an extension of their temporary parking permit must reapply.

#### **Description:**

The Food Share program is sponsored by Save-On-Foods. Every Friday of the year, 'Ksan Place receives contributions and in-kind donations of dairy products, vegetables, fruit, breads, and other bakery items that are nearing their best before date. Food is sorted, cleaned, and redistribute to those in need by volunteers. People come for a coffee visit and a bowl of soup/chilli and pick up a bag or two of groceries to take home for their families.

People served 2,305 at Food Share. This includes 807 hrs of volunteer time contributed with 4 regular volunteers and 2 culinary volunteers gaining experience to contribute to their next level of training in becoming a Chef. We also have 4 occasional volunteers contributing 37 hours.

**Description:** Stone Ridge Estates consists of 45 units of affordable housing, ranging from one to three bedrooms, including 6 adaptable units. These units are targeted at 30% below market rent, and tenants will not pay more than 30% of their income on rent.
